Youth & Discipleship Administrative Assistant Filled with drama and emotion, the book of Ruth tells the story of a young woman who lost everything but her will to trust in God. It concludes with her marriage to a man named Boaz, whose principal role in Ruth's life is defined in a single word: **redeemer**.

The purpose of this piece of history being included in the Bible may have been to describe the entrance of a Gentile woman into the ancestral bloodline of the Messiah. But I see an even grander lesson. Here is insight into God's ways of dealing with ruined people. Here is the picture of the *"kinsman-redeemer"* - a role and relationship God gave under the Old Covenant in order to help us understand His ways under the New.

The *kinsman-redeemer* law stated that if someone lost his possessions through the death of a loved one, another one of his "kin" could volunteer to repossess that which was lost (Leviticus 25:24, 25). The kinsman's "redeemer" role was fulfilled in two ways: (1) He had to acknowledge his relationship with the one who had suffered loss; and (2) he had to pay the price for the recovery of what had been lost.

In the case of Boaz's redeeming actions toward Ruth, he became both a **rescuer** and a **restorer**. Ruth was a foreigner and alien in a new cultural environment. Boaz received this disenfranchised widow as his wife and graciously secured her future through restoration of property she otherwise would have lost.

The force of this story emerges in its dynamic picture of what Jesus Christ has done and will do for everyone who puts his or her trust in Him. Jesus is the Savior, but He is even more that that! He is more than a Forgiver of our sins. He is even more than our Provider of eternal life. He is our Redeemer! He is the One who is ready to recover and restore what the power of sin and death has taken from us.

Here's how He does it:

• HE ACKNOWLEDGES US

The kinsman-redeemer pictured in the Old Testament had to step forward in open declaration of his relationship to the individual who had been shamed, embarrassed, or ruined by loss or failure. Just as Boaz responded to Ruth's appeal for help, the Lord Jesus Christ has fully come to us as a Kinsman. "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). God became "kin" to man! He took upon Himself the form of a servant and was made in the likeness of men (Philippians 2:7), fully demonstrating His willingness to associate with us - even though we have sinned against him.

But having become "one of us," He went one step further. He personally acknowledges a relationship to each of us: "He is not ashamed to call each of us His brothers - or sisters - His very own family" (Hebrews 2:11; my paraphrase). None of us has failed too badly or fallen too far to remove us from His willingness to identify with us.

• HE PAID THE PRICE

The word "redeem," as used in the Bible describes "a price that has been paid." In the pawn shop usage of the term, a broker gives a "redemption ticket" that a person may use to reclaim something he has sold for far less than its worth.

This is a picture of how sin works in human lives; tempting us to sell out for less than God's promised blessing, and leaving us with little or nothing as a reward. Yet, as with the rules of the "pawn shop redemption," recovery occurs when a great price is paid for the redeeming of what had been "sold cheap" and lost. And that is what Jesus did as Savior (Ephesians 1:7; 1 Peter 1:18-19).

• HE BRINGS FULL RECOVERY

Few realize the thrilling truth that Christ's payment for our "redemption" involves the ongoing, continual process of recovery . . .

. . . Next month I will continue this discussion focusing on the power of Jesus to bring about change unto full restoration!
